VISION SETTING

"Where there is no prophetic vision the people cast off restraint, but blessed is he who keeps the law," – Proverbs 29:18

The New Year offers us the opportunity to take inventory of our lives, consider what we might want to change, and then embark upon making that change. People often refer to this process as, "New Year's Resolutions." I learned a long time ago that making resolutions often fails, but setting goals often succeeds.

Goal setting often succeeds when it is aligned with a vision, and the vision is aligned with God's plan. The above verse from Proverbs 29:18 is often cited as, "Where there is no vision, the people perish." People then utilize this sentence from which to springboard towards vision setting for their life or for the organization to which they belong. However, they often overlook the other half of the verse: "But he that keepeth the law, happy is he." In other words, visioning for the future succeeds when it is rooted in God's presence now. Conversely, without a vision rooted in God's presence, God's people will wander "every which way."

The people of God are called to constant connection with Him through the Holy Spirit and His means of grace. A people rooted in Christ and connected to each other will receive a prophetic vision for



their future when they maintain their connection. Jesus' words from the Sermon on the Mount speak a powerful reminder to us when setting a vision, "Seek first the Kingdom of God and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well." Friends, I share all this with you because Calvary Church will begin the process of Vision Setting in 2022. First, though, we must continue growing in our relationship with God and each other as Pastor and Congregation. Therefore, we will embark upon the first of our spiritual formation opportunities this Lenten Season. The resource we will use for this spiritual formation opportunity will be, "The Good and Beautiful God: Falling in Love with the God Jesus Knows," by James Bryan Smith. Adult Sunday School classes will be invited to consider using their class time to discuss the book. Likewise, small groups will be developed to offer short-term opportunities for discussion. Additionally, I will offer expanded teaching from the pulpit in order to supplement the book reading and discussion. The desired outcome of our concentrated time in spiritual formation will be to seek God's Kingdom by addressing the false narratives we carry around about ourselves and God.

Please consider partnering with me in our spiritual formation this Lenten Season. The suggested donation for a book will be \$15.00. However, please do not allow money to be a barrier for you, as you

"I AM" A SERMON SERIES FOR EPIPHANY

The Gospel according to John records many significant events and sayings from the life of Jesus Christ. Perhaps the most profound of these sayings are the "I AM" statements of Jesus' self-proclaimed identity. Just as Jesus' Father revealed Himself to the Israelites in ages past (i.e. Moses at the Burning Bush, "I AM that I AM"), Jesus also revealed Himself to the people of Israel as "I AM." John records seven instances of Jesus referring to Himself as the great, "I AM." We will consider each "I AM" statement on the following Sundays:

- Open a web browser and go to smile.amazon.com
- Sign in with your regular Amazon account information. Or, if you don't already have an Amazon account, you can create one at this step.
- On the next screen, select your charity look for "Calvary United Methodist Church" with a Location of "Harrisburg, PA".
- Start shopping!! Remember to go to smile.amazon.com when you are shopping.

Tip: Update (or create) your Amazon bookmark/favorite to go to <u>smile.amazon.com</u> to make sure you're always using the right website.

Amazon App on Smart Phone

- Open the Amazon Shopping app.
- Navigate to the main menu (the "=" icon).
- Tap on Settings and then select "AmazonSmile."
- Select your charity (if you haven't done that already) and then follow the on-screen instructions to turn ON AmazonSmile in the mobile app.

Note: The tablet Amazon Shopping app does not yet support AmazonSmile. If you want to shop on your tablet, use a browser instead of the app.

When you shop using AmazonSmile, 0.5% of the purchase price of eligible items is donated to the charitable organization of your choice. Tens of millions of items are eligible for donations and there are over one million eligible 501(c)(3) public charitable organizations —

including Calvary UMC! US charities have received over \$275,000,000 through AmazonSmile since its launch in 2013.

2022 OFFERING ENVELOPES PLEASE NOTE THAT THE NUMBERS ARE CHANGING

The 2022 offering envelope boxes are available for pick up in the hallway between the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall through the end of January. After that, please call Nancy Flint in the church office to arrange pick up. Because it is cost-prohibitive, we do not normally mail church offering envelopes. You can help the transition to a new giving year go more smoothly by noting and doing the following:

- 1. 2022 ENVELOPE NUMBERS HAVE CHANGED. This is so that we can consolidate the numbers so that we can order less boxes of envelopes and not waste boxes of envelopes, as well as realize savings by ordering fewer envelope boxes.
- 2. To ensure proper credit for your offerings, please do not use 2022 envelopes until January 1st and do not use 2021 envelopes after January 1st.
- 3. We appreciate those who want to deliver another's envelope box to them, but please be sure to notify the person or the church office if you are doing so.
- 4. Please do double check the name and address label on the box and use the one that is specifically yours, and that the envelope number on the label matches the number on the envelopes.
- 5. Please do write your name on your offering envelopes in January to help us ensure that none have been mislabeled.

These steps will help us to maintain correct giving records for our contributors and we thank you for your assistance.




